Cannon of the City and County of New Haven, State of Connecticut, do hereby certify that on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of February A.D. 1863 I was First Lieut. in the First Light Battery Conn. Vols. that Henry B. Bullard who enlisted from the Town of Guilford Conn. was at that time a member of said Company and died of the Measles on board the transport Elwood Walter, while entering the Harbor of Port Royal, on said 6<sup>th</sup> day of February and while in the Military service of the United States as a private in said Battery, and I further certify that I have no interest whatsoever in the application of the Mother of said Henry B. Bullard for a pension.

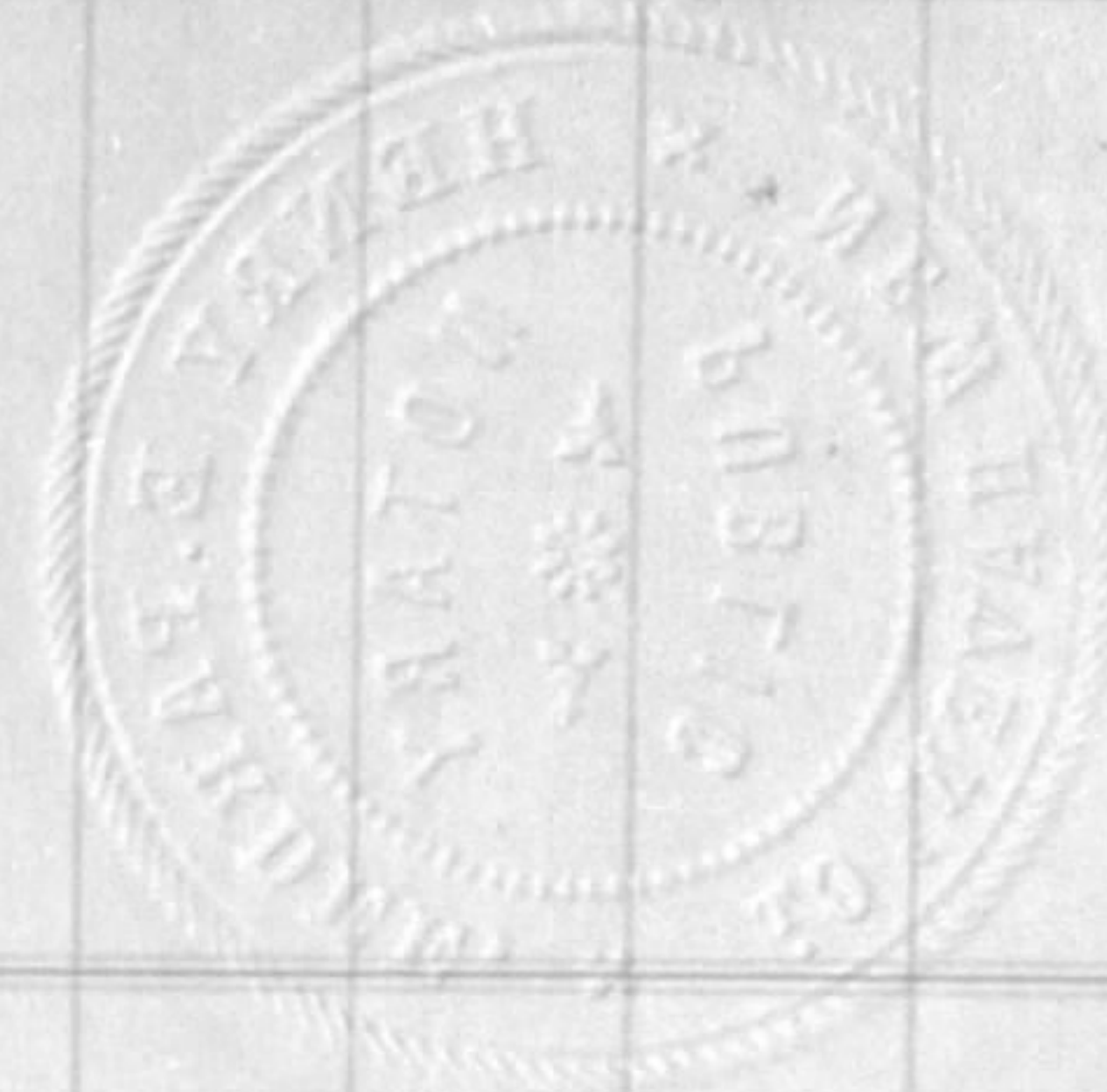
