Howler aged 64 years, and Cherry Howler aged
63 years, residents of the Town of Guilford, State of
Connecticut, whom I certify to be respectable and
intitled to credit, who being by me duly sworn
according to law, say that they do reside, and are aged
as aforesaid. That they have resided in Guilford
State of Connecticut since the year 1827, that on
the 26th day of September, 1841, they were present at the
house of one James Sibley in said
Town of Guilford, and witnessed the marriage ceremony
performed, according to the rites of the Methodist
Episcopal Church, between Samuel Howler 2nd
and Eliza Ann Hill, by the Rev. Edwin Howl
pastor of the Methodist Episcopal Church in Guilford,
Conn. That the said Eliza Ann Hill, then married,
is the identical person who now claims arrears of
pay and the bounty, as the widow of Samuel Howler
2nd, and that she is his widow. And they further
swear that they have no interest in her claim for
arrears of pay and the bounty.

Widow's Application for Pension

State of Connecticut, }
County of New Haven } ss.

On this 19th day of January A. D., one thousand eight hundred and sixty five, personally appeared before me Edward R. Sanders, Judge, Clerk of Probate District of Guilford which is a Court of record, Eliza Ann Fowler a resident of Guilford, County of New Haven, and State of Connecticut, aged 41 years, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress approved July 14th, 1862. That she is the widow of Samuel Fowler 2^d who was a private in Company "A" commanded by Captain Joseph Bradley, in the 2^d Regiment of Conn. Vols. in the war of 1861, who was a Georgetown D. C. of wounds received at the battle of Fredericksburg Virginia on the 9th day of January, 1863, while in the service of the United States, and in the line of his duty.

She further declares that she was married to the said Samuel Fowler 2^d on the 26th day of September, 1841, by Rev. Edwin Stockbridge at Guilford Conn.; that her husband, the aforesaid Samuel Fowler 2^d, died on the day above mentioned, and that she has remained a widow ever since that period, and that her name before she was married was Eliza Ann Hill. And she also declares that she has not, in any manner, been engaged in, or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States. She also declares that there

the said Samuel Fowler 2^d left under the age of sixteen years one child, to wit Theodore S. Fowler aged twelve years who was born on the 13th of February 1852.

and that she now resides in Guilford County of New Haven State of Conn., and that she hereby appoints Capt. Richard Draper, Post Adj. General of Connecticut her attorney, with full power of substitution, to procure for her from the United States such pension as she is entitled to, and to receive such certificate as may be issued for the same.

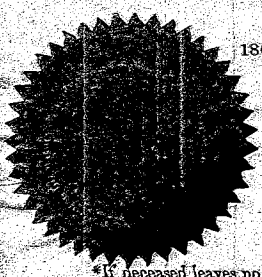

Drake residents of Guilford, in the State of Connecticut, persons whom I certify to be respectable and entitled to credit, and who, being by me duly sworn, say that they were present, and saw Eliza Ann Fowler sign her name to the foregoing declaration, and they further swear that they have every reason to believe, from the appearance of the applicant and their acquaintance with her, that she is the identical person she represents herself to be, and that they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim. Also that they know the said Eliza Ann Fowler is the widow of the within named Samuel Fowler 2^d, who performed the military service mentioned in the declaration, from a personal acquaintance with her of about 20 years, and with her said husband of about 20 years before his death. That they lived together, and were reputed to be husband and wife, and that she has remained a widow since his death, and that the said Samuel Fowler 2^d left one child under the age of sixteen years viz: Theodore S. Fowler aged 12 years

That they reside as aforesaid, and that their means of knowledge of all these facts are derived from personal knowledge of the facts above stated, they having resided near the said Samuel Fowler 2^d in said Guilford.

I, 27th Regiment of Conn Volunteers, to serve 9 Months years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. I of that Regiment, for the month of dated July 27 1863, he is reported died in hospital Washington on Jan 9th 1863 of wounds recd Battle Fredericksburg Dec 13th 1862

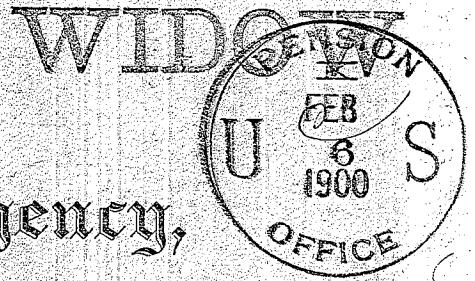

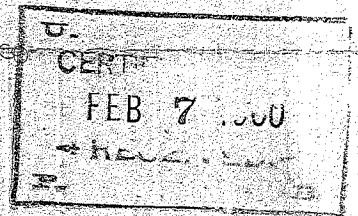

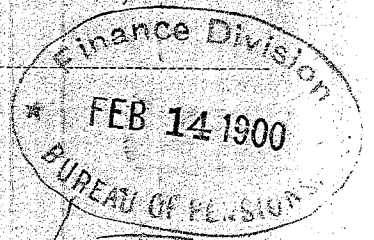
