 aforesaid, Harriet A. Woodruff, aged 42 years,
 a resident of the Town of Guilford, State of Conn-
 ecticut, whom I certify to be respectable and
 entitled to credit, who being by me duly sworn
 according to law, deposes and says that she does
 reside and is aged as aforesaid, That she has
 resided in said town of Guilford during her
 whole life: That on the 22nd day of January
 1843, she was present at the house of the Rev.
 Samuel D. Cochran, in the City and State of
 New York, and witnessed the marriage cere-
 mony performed between Richard S. Hull and
 Nancy P. Fowler by the Rev. Samuel D. Cochran
 the officiating clergyman at said marriage.
 That the said Nancy P. Fowler, then married,
