On this 23rd day of August AD 1866 personally appeared before me a Judge of Probate in and for the District of Guilford County and state aforesaid, Jane S. Farmer aged 41 years a resident of Guilford in the County of New Haven and State of Connecticut who being first duly sworn according to law doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the second section of the Act of Congress increasing the pensions of Widows and Orphans approved July 25th 1866. That she is the widow of Joel C. Farmer who was a Private in Co "C" Commanded by Capt. Taylor in the 27th Regt of Connecticut Volunteers in the war of 1861 and that by reason of his death in the service aforesaid she has been granted a pension of eight dollars per month in accordance with a Certificate numbered 79.181 and bearing date July 24th 1866.
