commanded by Samuel Drake in the 14th Regiment of
Connecticut Volunteers in the War of 1861, who died at Washington
Jan 28th 1864 She further states she has two children viz
Millie Nathan aged 11 years August 31st /63 Emma Augusta
aged 9 March 1st /63

She further declares that she was married to the said Nathan C. Clements
on the first day of June in the year 1851 that her husband
the aforesaid Nathan C. Clements died on the day above mentioned
and that she has remained a widow ever since that period, as will more fully appear by reference to
the proof hereto annexed. She also declares that she has not, in any manner, been engaged in, or
aided or abetted the rebellion in the UNITED STATES.

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 44,963, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Nathan C. Clement, was enrolled on the 4th day of Aug., 1862, at Madison in Co. G, 14th Regiment of Connecticut Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Corporal on the 20th day of Aug., 1862, at Hartford, Conn., in Co. G, 14th Regiment of Connecticut Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. G of that Regiment, for the months of January & February, 1864, he is reported Died at Kalorama Hosp. Washington D. C. January 30th 1864. cause of death not stated.
