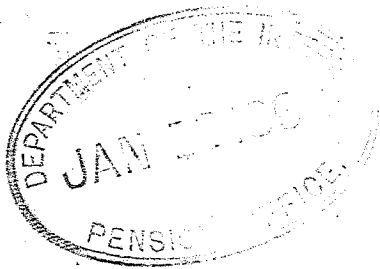

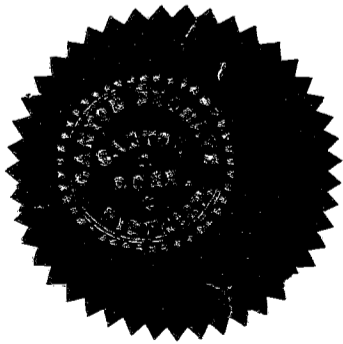

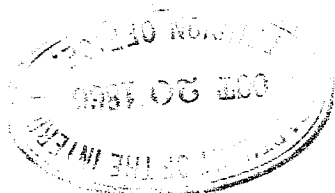

In reply to yours of the 10th inst requesting information ^{as to} of the condition of claim No. 123,895 of Julia M. Jackson widow of Abraham, a discrepancy exists between the evidences of marriage, filed at different dates.

In the copy of License filed with application in March 1866 it is certified by Levi Case, 2nd Registrar, that the parties declared their intention of marriage March 29, 1855, while the Judge Probate S. P. Norton states under seal that David B. Hale, Registrar, appeared before him and made oath that the above certificate by him

subscribed, is true and correct. Claimant also gives the date of marriage as March 29. 1855-

In the copy of Town Record of Canton David B. Hale Registrar, under date of March 2. 1868, certifies that the parties were married March 29. 1854.

The evident disagreement of the two papers, each purporting to be a copy of the official record, must be satisfactorily explained before the claim for pension can be allowed.
