Death.

Letter of Capt J. D. Wheeler, April 17. 1863, to Claimant shows soldier died of Malignant Erysipelas; that he had been suffering from Chronic Rheumatism which weakened him so much that he had not sufficient strength to resist disease. His affidavit shows disease resulted from exposure in line of duty.

said County and State Maria S
Dalph aged 34 years a resident of
Clinton in the State of Connecticut
who being duly sworn, according to
law doth on her oath make the
following declaration in order to
obtain the benefit of the provision
made by the Act of Congress appro-
ved July 14th 1862 That she is a
widow of William Dalph who was
a private in Company G comman-
ded by Capt Wheeler in the 15th
Regiment Conn. Vols. in the war
of 1861 who died at Suffolk Va
in the Regimental Hospital on the
17th day of April 1863 of Malignant
Erysipelas She further declares
that she was married to the said
William Dalph on the day of 7th May
in the year 1862 that her husband the
aforesaid William Dalph died on the
day above mentioned and that

She has remained a Widow
Ever since that period as will
more fully appear by reference to the
proofs to annexed. She also
declares that she has not in any
manner been engaged in or aided
or abetted the rebellion in the United
States.
