On this ~~Eleventh~~ day of February
A.D. 1863 personally appeared before me,
Waldo P. Vinal Judge of Probate in and
for the District of Middletown in said County
(the same being a Court of Record having a Clerk
and seal) Lavinia J. Norton a resident
of Middletown in the County of Middlesex and
State of Connecticut aged Thirty three years,
who being first duly sworn according to law,
doth on her oath make the following declaration,
in order to obtain the benefit of the provision
made by the act of Congress approved July 14
1862: That she is the widow of John Norton
a Corporal in Company I commanded first by
Capt. David Dickerson and subsequently by Capt.
Johnson, in the Twenty first (21) Regiment
of Connecticut volunteers in the war of 1861,
who died at or near a place called Falmouth
in the State of Virginia on the 24th day of December
A.D. 1862 of Typhoid Fever.

She further declares that she was married
to the said John Norton on the 13th day of September

A.D. 1847 that her husband, the aforesaid John Norton died on the day above mentioned, and that she has remained a widow ever since that period: That she is the mother of one child by the said John Norton, named Charles H. Norton born the 14th day of March 1849 - and now living in said Middletown - as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed. She also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged in or aided or abetted, the rebellion in the United States,
