On the 14th day of May 1866 personally appeared before me, Egbert Eggleston and Henry B. Griswold

residents of the town of Guilford County of Newhaven State of Connecticut who being duly sworn do depose and say that they have been personally acquainted with Mrs Ruth W Bullard and the members of her family for 10 years Her husband Levi Bullard died in Guilford County of Newhaven State of Connecticut on the 12th day of November 1854, leaving the said Ruth W Bullard ^{with} four children three of them under twenty-one years of age. One of whom her son Henry B Bullard supported her and the younger children by his labor untill the 22^d of October, A.D. 1861, when he enlisted in the Third Battery of Connecticut Light Artillery

He died in the service of his country on or about the 9th day of February 1862 leaving neither widow nor child. For years the said Ruth W. Bullard has been in such infirm health as to be unable to labor and she has no visible means of support except a house and land valued and taxed for the sum of eight hundred dollars

said property is encumbered by mortgage for the sum of four hundred and forty dollars

And deponents do further depose and say they are not interested directly or indirectly in the result of the application of said Ruth W. Bullard for a partition
