above referred to.

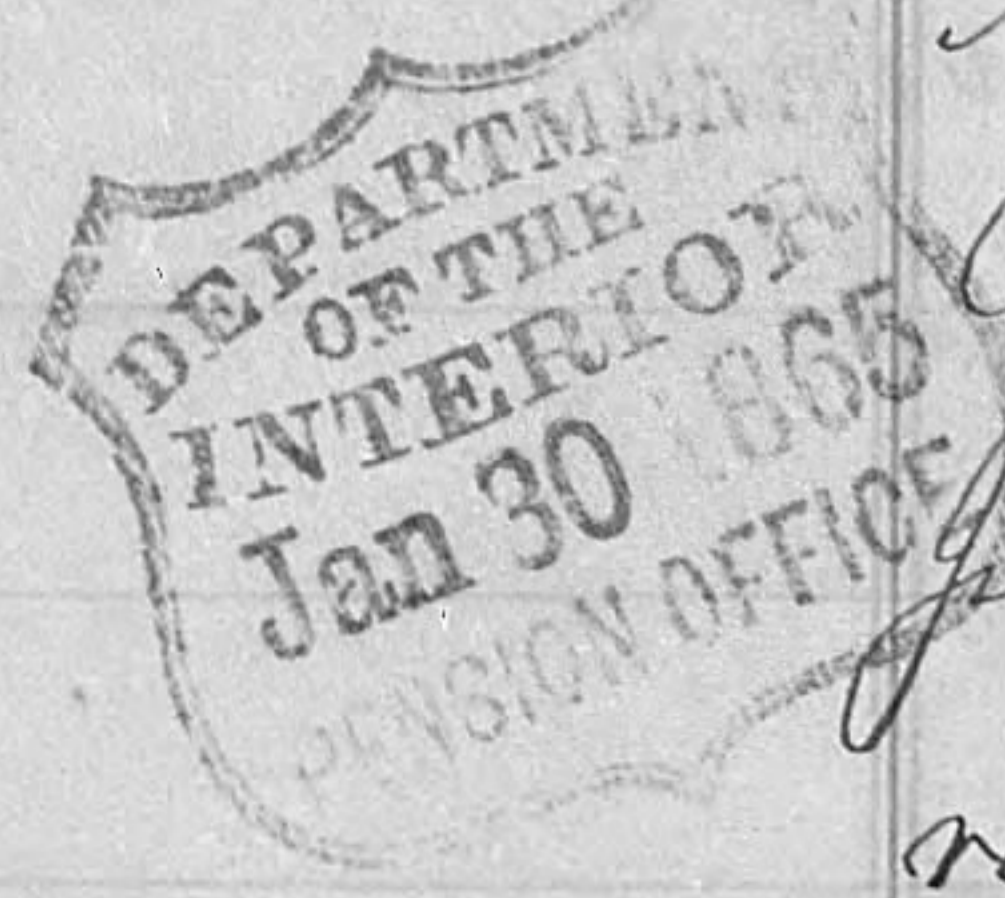

On this 21st day of October AD 1864 before me Edward R. Landon
Judge of the Court of Probate for the District of Guilford a court of
record in and for the County and State, above named, personally
appeared Jane P. Parnellee, a resident of the town of Guilford, in
said New Haven County and State, aged thirty nine years, who being duly
sworn, according to law, doth on her oath, make the following
Declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision,
made by the act of Congress approved July 14th 1862, that
she is the widow of Joel C. Parnellee, who was a private in
Company (C) commanded by Captain Addison C. Taylor of
the twenty seventh Regiment of Connecticut Volunteers, in the
war of 1861, who died at Fredericksburg in the State of Virginia, on
or about the 13th day of December AD 1862, while in the
service of the United States, in consequence of wounds received in
the said battle of Fredericksburg.

She further declares that she was married to the said
Joel C. Parnellee on the third day of June in the year of our Lord
One Thousand Eight Hundred and fifty two and that her name before
marriage as aforesaid was Jane P. Parwell, that her husband
the aforesaid Joel C. Parnellee died on the day above mentioned
- 13th day of December AD 1862 - and that she has remained a
widow ever since that period, and she further states that
she believes there is a public record of her said marriage
which is hereto annexed. That the following is the name
and age of each and all the children of the said deponent and
now living, by her said husband Joel C. Parnellee deceased,
who were under sixteen years of age at the time of their said
father's death, viz Ella Maria Parnellee born Sept^r 13. 1853.

Emma Jane Parnellee born Sept^r 29 1855.

Minnie Elizabeth Parnellee born June 15. 1857.

Sarah Jennette Parnellee born January 17. 1859.

and Edward Lincoln Parnellee born October 2^d 1860.

as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto

annexed, the evidence filed herewith, and with the proper department, to establish her claim.

She also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged in or aided or abetted in the rebellion of the United States; that she is not in the receipt of a pension under the 2^d section of the act above mentioned, or under any other act, nor has she again married since the death of her husband the said Joel P. Parmelee - that her post office address is Guilford in said NewHamp county, Vermont to which she directs all communications and the certificate of pension to be sent to her.

Drake both residents of said Guilford in said NewHamp county and State of Vermont, persons whom I certify to be respectable and entitled to credit and who being by me duly sworn, say that they were present and saw Jane P. Parmelee sign her name to the foregoing declaration; and they further swear that they have every reason to believe from the appearance of the applicant and their previous acquaintance with her, that she is the identical person she represents herself to be and that they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim.
