G., 15th Regiment of Conn Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Private on the 25th day of Aug. 1862, at New Haven Ct, in Co. G., 15th Regiment of Conn Volunteers, to serve three years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. G of that Regiment, for the months of ~~later~~ June 27th 1865, he is reported "Killed in action near Kinston N.C. March 8th 1865"
