the 22<sup>nd</sup> of Oct. 1861. " furnished his mother her clothing, boarded  
her and paid her Dr. Bills, also rec. his wages and bounty.  
Declared. Attorney has filed newspapers since Oct. 12 " /63  
Claimant.

Admitted June 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1866, to a Pension of \$ 8 per month,

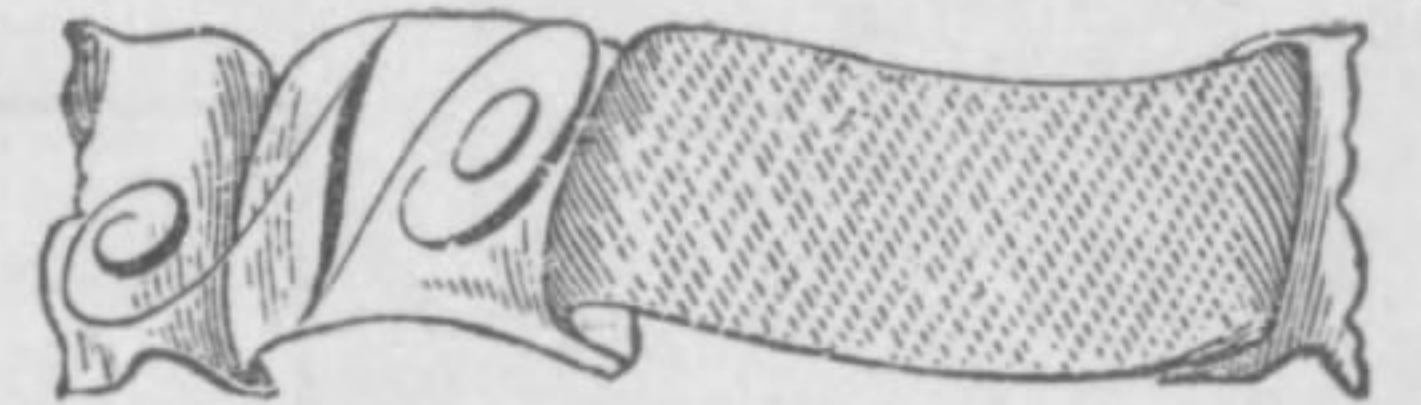

On this 15<sup>th</sup> day of November  
A. D. 1862, personally appeared before  
the subscriber Judge  
of the Court of Probate for the District of Guilford  
Mrs Ruth W. Bullard a resident of

Guilford in the County of New Haven and State of Connecticut  
aged Forty nine years, who being first duly sworn according to  
law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefits of the provisions  
made by Act of Congress, approved July 14th, 1862, that she is the widow of Levi Bullard  
and mother of Henry B. Bullard who was a  
Private in Company called the 1<sup>st</sup> Connecticut Battery of Artillery commanded by  
Capt<sup>n</sup> A. P. Rockwell in the Regiment of  
in the War of 1861, who died on board the Elwood Walter at Port Royal  
Harbor in the State of South Carolina on or about the 14<sup>th</sup> day of February  
AD 1862; said death by a disease to wit measles contracted while in the  
service of the United States and while in the line of his duty & after entering his said service  
she further declares that her said son, upon whom she was mainly  
dependent for support, having left no widow or minor children under sixteen years of age surviving,  
declarant makes this application for a pension under the above-mentioned act, and refers to the evidence  
filed herewith, and that in the proper department to establish her claim. She also declares that she  
has not in any way been engaged in, or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States; that she  
is not in the receipt of a pension under the 2d section of the act above mentioned, or under any other act,  
nor has she again married since the death of her son, the said Henry B. Bullard

The time, place, and cause of the death of the deceased son should be plainly and distinctly stated. Also, state if the mother was, wholly or in part, dependent upon her deceased son for support.
