On this *first* day of *August* A.D. 1863, before me, *Arthur D. Boston* Clerk of the Superior Court for the County of *New Haven* a Court of Record in and for the County and State above named, personally appeared *Mrs. Jane Parmelee* a resident of *Guilford* in the State of Connecticut, aged *38* years, who being duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the Act of Congress, approved July 14th, 1862, that she is the widow of *Joel Parmelee* who was a *private* in Company *Co.*, commanded by Captain *Taylor* of the *27* Regiment of Connecticut Volunteers in the war of 1861, who died at *Fredericksburg* on or about the *thirteenth* day of *December* 1862 while in the service of the United States, in consequence of *wounds received in the battle of Fredericksburg December 19th A.D. 1862*

She further declares that she was married to the said *Joel Parmelee* on the *third* day of *June* in the year eighteen hundred and *fifty two*, that her name before her said marriage was *Jane Burwell*. That her husband, the aforesaid *Joel Parmelee* died on the day above mentioned, and that she has remained a widow ever since that period. And she further states that she believes there is *no* public record of her said marriage, and there is *no* private or family record. That the following is the name and age of each and all the children of the said deponent, and *are* now living, who were under sixteen years of age at the time of their said father's death, viz: *Ella Maria Parmelee aged nine years, Emma Jane Parmelee aged seven years, Minnie Elizabeth Parmelee aged six years, Sarah Genette Parmelee aged four years, Edward Lincoln Parmelee two years* as will more fully appear, by reference to the proof hereto annexed, the evidence filed herewith, and that in the proper department, to establish her claim.

She also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged in, or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States; that she is not in the receipt of a pension under the 2d Section of the act above mentioned, or under any other act, nor has she again married since the death of her husband, the said *Joel Parmelee*. She hereby constitutes and appoints *Edwin W. Blackman* of New Haven, Connecticut, her Attorney to prosecute this claim, and authorizes him to receive her Pension Certificate. That her Post-Office address is *Guilford Conn. of Guilford County of New Haven State of Connecticut*.

Burwell* residents of *New Haven & Guilford* in the County of *New Haven* and State of *Connecticut* persons whom I certify to be respectable and entitled to credit, and who, being by me duly sworn, say, that they were present and saw *Jane T. Parmelee* sign her name to the foregoing declaration; and they further swear that they have every reason to believe, from the appearance of the applicant and their acquaintance with her, that she is the identical person she represents herself to be, and that they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim.

Parmelee* who has made and subscribed the foregoing declaration, and were acquainted with her and her said husband before he entered the service, and know that the said *Jane T. Parmelee* and *Joel C. Parmelee* lived together as man and wife, and were so reputed. That she is the widow of the identical *Joel C. Parmelee* above named, who performed the military service mentioned in said declaration, and has remained a widow since his death. That their knowledge of the identity of her husband the soldier, and the names and ages of their said children above named is derived from *personal acquaintance*

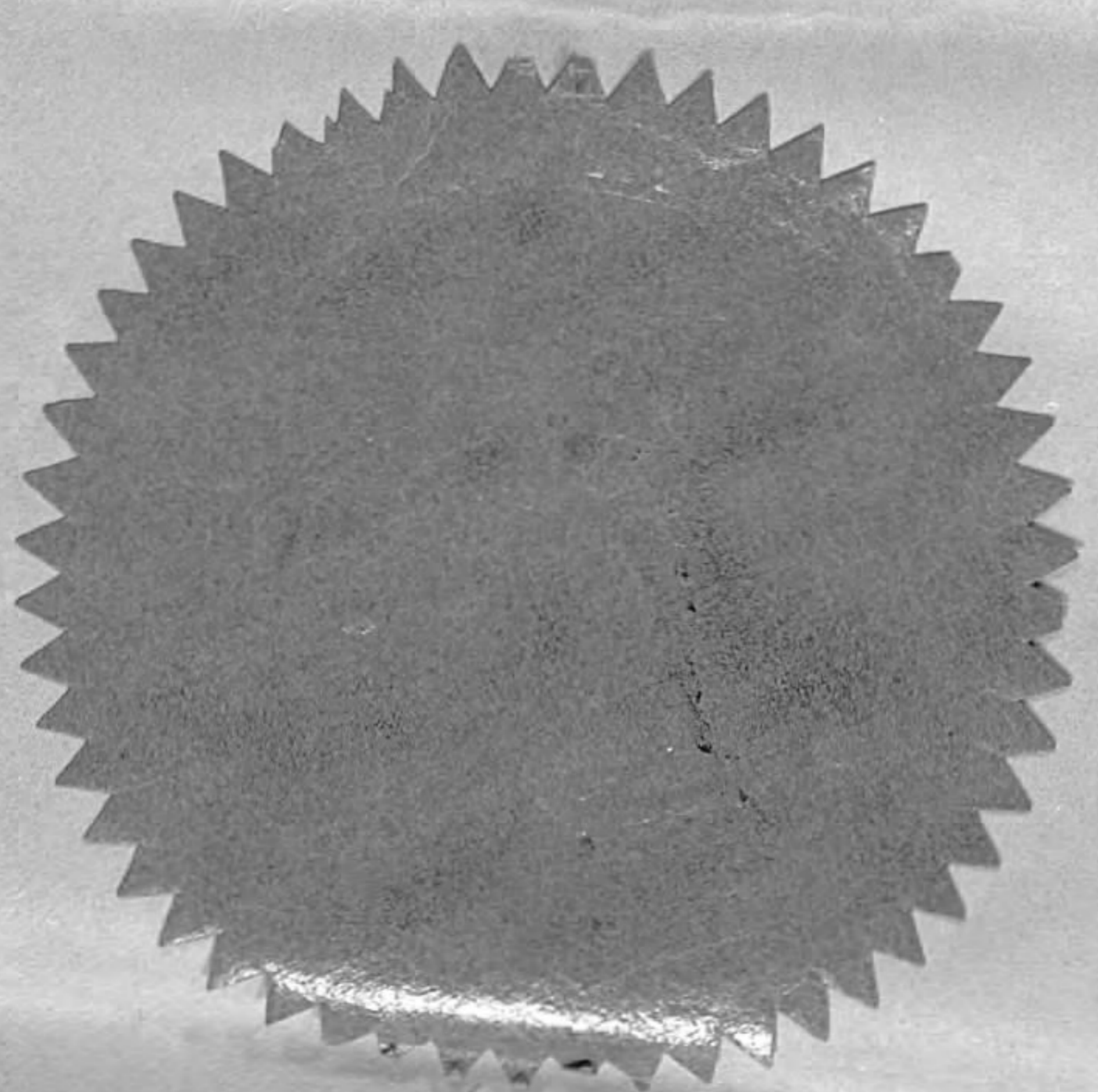

And they further testify that they reside as above stated, and are disinterested in this claim.

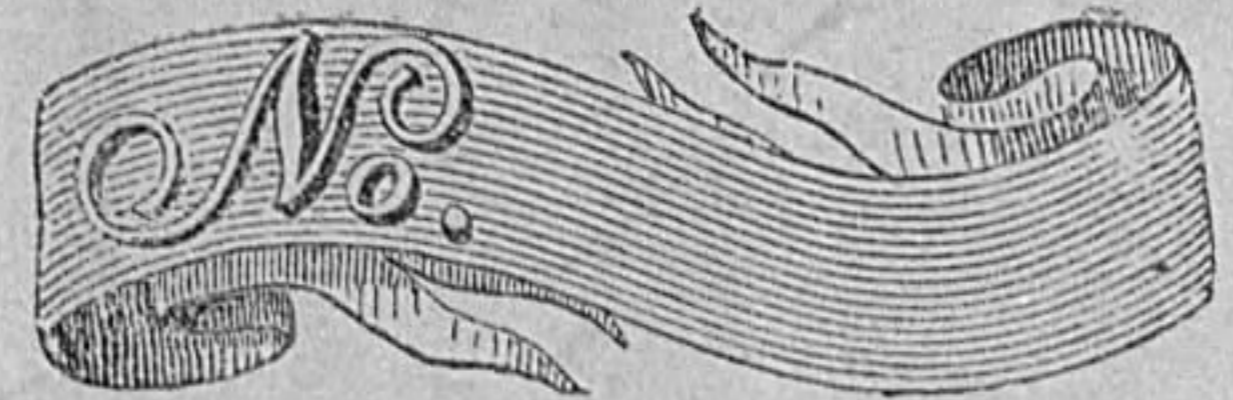

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 45,806, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Jaeh C. Sameter was enrolled on the 13th day of Sept, 1862, at New Haven in Co. "C", 27th Regiment of Conn Volunteers, to serve 9 months years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Priv on the 4th day of Oct 1862, at New Haven Ct, in Co. "C", 27th Regiment of Conn Volunteers, to serve 9 months years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. "C" of that Regiment, for the months of Dated July 27th 1863, he is reported "Missing since the Battle of Fredericksburg Dec 13th 1862". No evidence of death on file in this Office.
