DECLARATION OF A WIDOW WHO HAS REMARRIED.

(Acts of March 3, 1901, and February 28, 1903, Amending Section 4708, Revised Statutes.)

On this 21st day of October, A. D. one thousand nine hundred and seven

personally appeared before me, a Natary Public within and for the county and State aforesaid, Mary A. Riggs, aged 72 years, a resident of Derby, County of New Haven, State of Connecticut, who, being duly sworn according to law, makes the following declaration

for the purpose of having her name placed on the pension roll under provisions of the acts of March 3, 1901, and February 28, 1903, amending section 4708, Revised Statutes:

That she was formerly the widow of Samuel B. Dana, who died September, 1864, by reason of wound or injury received or disease contracted while serving as Sargeant in Co K 13th Regt Conn Vol Inf, in the war

Rebellion - 1861-1865 That she was his lawful wife during the period of his service in said war, (Name the war in which he served.)

having been married to him June 7th, 1857, and that she remained his lawful wife to the date of his death.

That said soldier was not in the military or naval service of the United States prior to Dec 30, 1861.

(If any other service, it should be stated in full.)

That she or a child or children was formerly pensioned on account of the death of said soldier; that the pension was paid by the United States pension agent at New Haven Connecticut, and that the number of the pension certificate was _____ That she never received any other pension from the United States nor made any other application for pension.

(If she was ever pensioned or made a claim for pension on

account of any other soldier, his name, service, and relationship should be stated.)

That her pension or right to pension terminated because of her marriage to Royal B. Riggs

That said marriage took place Dec 30th, 1869

at Derby Conn That said husband died August 20th, 1890

at Derby Conn (or) That she was divorced from said husband, upon her own application and without fault on her part, on the _____ day of _____, 18____, at _____

That said last-named husband did not serve in the Army or Navy of the United States.

That she did not marry again after the death of the soldier except to Royal B. Riggs named above.

(If she contracted any other marriage after the death of the soldier, the name of the husband, the date and place of the marriage,

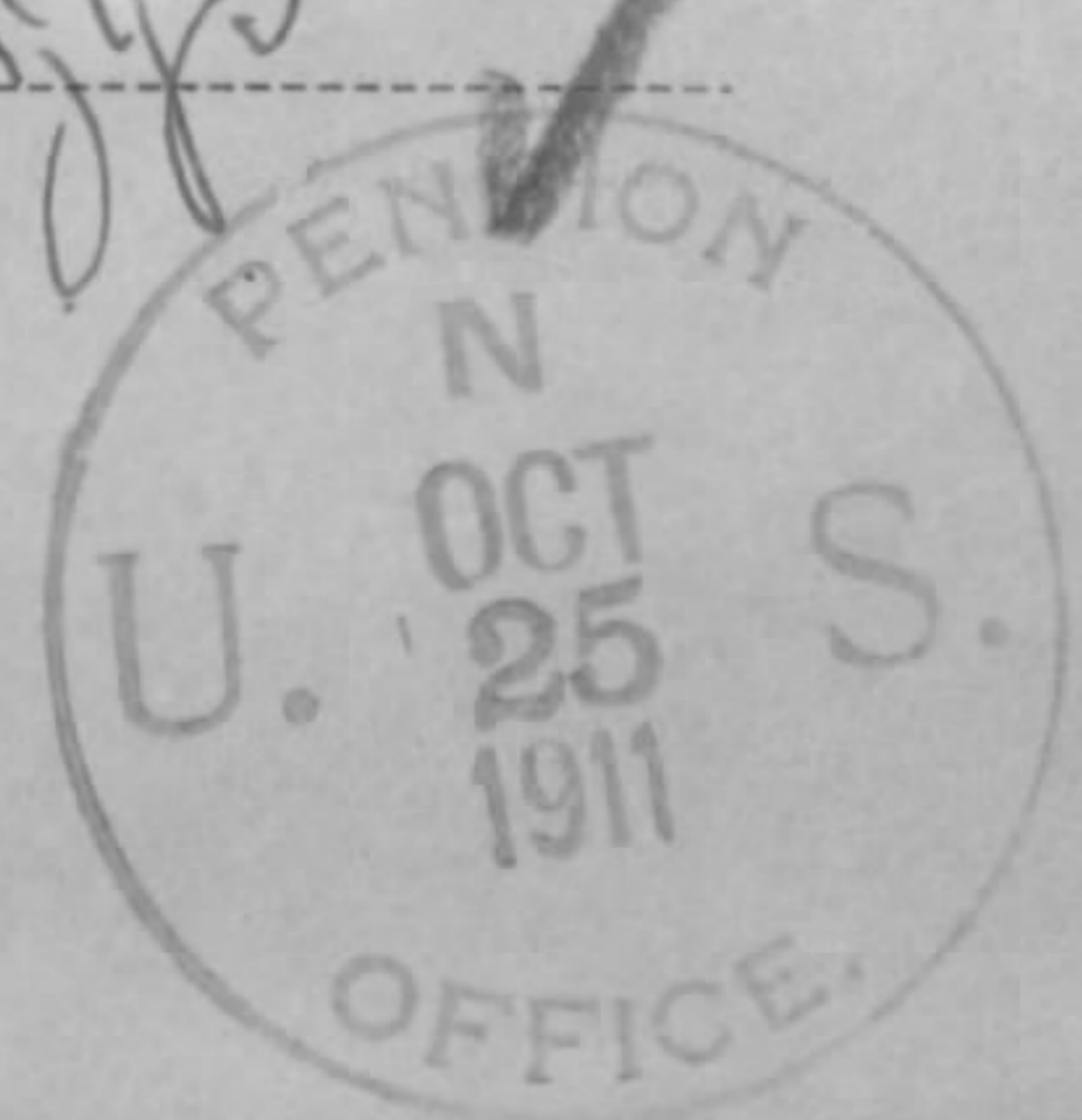
