

Civil War Letters of Sgt. Alfred N. Wilcox, 14th Connecticut Infantry Volunteers

In the war Sgt. Wilcox served in the following battles:

Antietam - September 17, 1862. He was Color Corporal. He carried Captain Williard off the field where he died.

Fredericksburg - September 12, 13, 14, 1862

Chancellorville - May 2, 3, 1863

Gettysburg - July 2, 3, 4 1863. He was Color Corporal. After the battle of Bliss Barn he helped bury Moses Clements, a fellow Guilfordite.

Cedar Mountain - September 17, 1863

Bristoe's Station - October 14, 1863

Mine Run - November 30, 1863

Wilderness - May 5, 6, 1864 - *Did not fight - was then a member of the Co C 15th Reg VRC.*

He contracted typhoid fever and was in the hospital in Washington.

In civilian life he worked as a joiner and cabinet maker. He built the communion table for the First Congregational Church which is presently used in the narthex of the church.

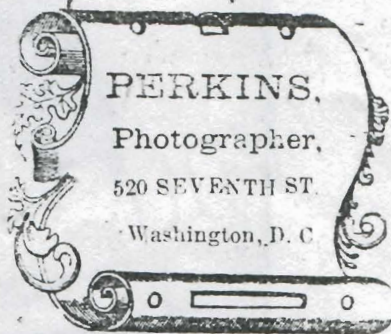
