Form of Declaration for obtaining a Widow's Army Pension.

On this 5th day of September A. D. one thousand eight hundred and sixty 3, personally appeared before me Lewis S. Tuttle Clerk of Probate for the District of New Haven

Jane E. Clement a resident of Guilford in the county of New Haven and state of Conn, aged 36 years, who, being first-duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, approved July 14, 1862: That she is the widow of Moses G. Clement who was a Private in company Co. G commanded by Capt. Hiske in the 14th regiment of Conn. Vols in the war of 1861, who on or about the 3rd day of July 1863 at Gettysburg Penn came to his death by reason of was killed in battle

She further declares that she was married to the said Moses G. Clement on the 5th day of December in the year 1858; that her husband, the afore-said Moses G. Clement died on the day above mentioned, and that she has remained a widow ever since that period, Said Moses G. Clement left no children

as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed. She also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged in, or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States.

Also personally appeared Jane E. Clement, Edward W. Leete and Warren B. Leete residents of Guilford in the state of Connecticut persons whom I certify to be respectable, and entitled to credit, and who being by me duly sworn, say that they were present and saw Said Jane E. Clement sign her name to the foregoing declaration; and they further swear that they have every reason to believe, from the appearance of the applicant and their acquaintance with her, that she is the identical person she represents herself to be; and they further state that said Moses G. Clement left no children and that said claimant remains a widow, and that they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim.

Declarations must be made before a Court of Record, or an officer of such court authorized to administer oaths and having custody of its seal. Testimony may be taken before any officer having authority to administer oaths. Their official character must be certified to, under the seal of the clerk of the court, or county clerk.

- 1.—State whether a judge or other officer of the court.
- 2.—Applicant's name.
- 3.—Soldier's name.
- 4.—His rank.
- 5.—Letter of the company.
- 6.—Name of captain.
- 7.—Number of the regiment.
- 8.—To what service the regiment belonged.
- 9.—Day and month of soldier's death.
- 10.—At what place.
- 11.—Cause of death.
- 12.—Soldier's name.
- 13.—If the widow has children under 16, state their names, ages and places of residence.
- 14.—Declarant's signature.
- 15.—Names of witnesses.
- 16.—Place of residence.
- 17.—Declarant's name. And insert, sign her name or make her mark, as the case may be.
- 18.—If the widow has children under 16, state their names and ages at the husband's death.
- 19.—Witnesses' signatures.
- 20.—Signature of judge or other officer.
- 21.—Declarant's post office address.

Agents and attorneys require a power of attorney to prosecute claims in the pension office.

I, Jane E. Clement the before named applicant for a widow's pension, do hereby make, constitute and appoint Henry Rogers of New Haven in the state of Connecticut, my agent and attorney, to procure for me, from the United States, such pension as I am entitled to, and to receive for me such certificate as may be issued for the same.

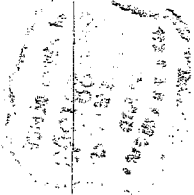

14th Regiment of Conn Volunteers, to
serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into
service as a Private on the 28th day of August,
1862, at Hartford Conn, in Co. G, 14th
Regiment of Conn Volunteers, to serve 3
years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. G
of that Regiment, for the months of July & August,
1863, he is reported "Killed at Gettysburg July 3rd 1863"

The pension certificate must accompany an application for transfer. In applications of Guardians the names of the wards and of the soldier must be inserted. If the pension agent personally knows the magistrate before whom the application is sworn to, or has on file at the agency a certificate of the authority of said magistrate, the certificate of the agent as to his official character is sufficient; otherwise, the same must be duly certified. The interposition of an attorney in securing a transfer is unnecessary.

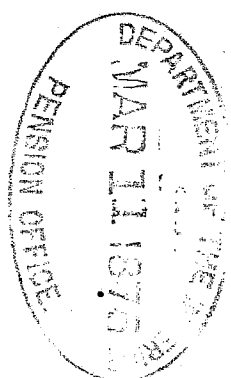
