It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office, that Richard H Fowler was enrolled on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of Sept, 1862, at S. H. in Co. A, 27<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Conn Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war, and mustered into service as a Sgt on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of Oct, 1862, at New Haven, in Co. A, 27<sup>th</sup> Regiment of Conn Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Monthly Return ~~Mustered Roll of Co. A~~ of that Regiment, for the month of December, 1862, he is reported "Die Dec. 17<sup>th</sup> 1862 of wounds received at Fredericksburg."
