### Form of Declaration for obtaining a Widow's Army Pension.

State of Connecticut }

On this 5<sup>th</sup> day of September A. D., one thousand eight hundred and sixty 3, personally appeared before me Lucius B. Tuttle Clerk of Probate for the District of New Haven

Jane E. Clement a resident of Guilford in the county of New Haven and state of Conn, aged 36 years, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by the act of Congress, approved July 14, 1862: That she is the widow of Moses G. Clement who was a Private in company G. commanded by Capt. Hiske in the 14<sup>th</sup> regiment of Conn. Vols in the war of 1861, who on or about the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of July 1863 at Gettysburg Penn came to his death by reason of was killed in battle

She further declares that she was married to the said Moses G. Clement on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of December in the year 1858; that her husband, the afore-said Moses G. Clement, died on the day above mentioned, and that she has remained a widow ever since that period, Said Moses G. Clement left no children

as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed. She also declares that she has not in any manner been engaged in, or aided or abetted the rebellion in the United States.

Also personally appeared Jane E. Clement Edward W. Leete and Harriet R. Leete residents of Guilford in the state of Connecticut persons whom I certify to be respectable, and entitled to credit, and who being by me duly sworn, say that they were present and saw said Jane E. Clement sign her name to the foregoing declaration; and they further swear that they have every reason to believe, from the appearance of the applicant and their acquaintance with her, that she is the identical person she represents herself to be; and they further state that said Moses G. Clement left no children and that said claimant remains a widow, and that they have no interest in the prosecution of this claim.
