B. Declaration for Widow's Army Pension.

State of Connecticut }
County of New Haven }

On this 23^d day of May A. D. 1865, personally appeared before me, a Notary Public of the town of New Haven, in and for the County and State aforesaid, Mrs. Harman B. Johnson, a resident of the town of New Haven, in the County of New Haven and State of Connecticut aged 42 years, who, being first duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefits of the provision made by the act of Congress, approved July 14, 1862, granting Pensions: That she is the widow of Harman B. Johnson, who was a Private in Company B, commanded by Lieut. George Beach, when said Johnson fell, in the 15th Regiment of Connecticut Infantry mustered into the service of the United States from the State of Connecticut in the war of 1861, and who died (or was killed) at Kinston, North Carolina

on the 30th day of March A. D. 1865, as this deponent verily believes. She further declares that she was lawfully married to the said Harman B. Johnson at the town of Guilford, in the State of Connecticut by the Rev. R. Wymond a Methodist minister on the 13th day of March A. D. 1844; that her husband, the aforesaid Harman B. Johnson, died on the day above mentioned, as she verily believes, and she remained his faithful wife until his decease. She further declares that she has remained his widow ever since the death of her said husband, Harman B. Johnson, as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto annexed. She further declares that she had, by said deceased husband, two children now living, under the age of sixteen years, named, aged, and residing as follows: first, William Henry Johnson, aged thirteen years, and second, Annette Bell, aged four years, both of whom are residing in said town and County of New Haven and State of Connecticut

Johnson, and has no remains since his death.

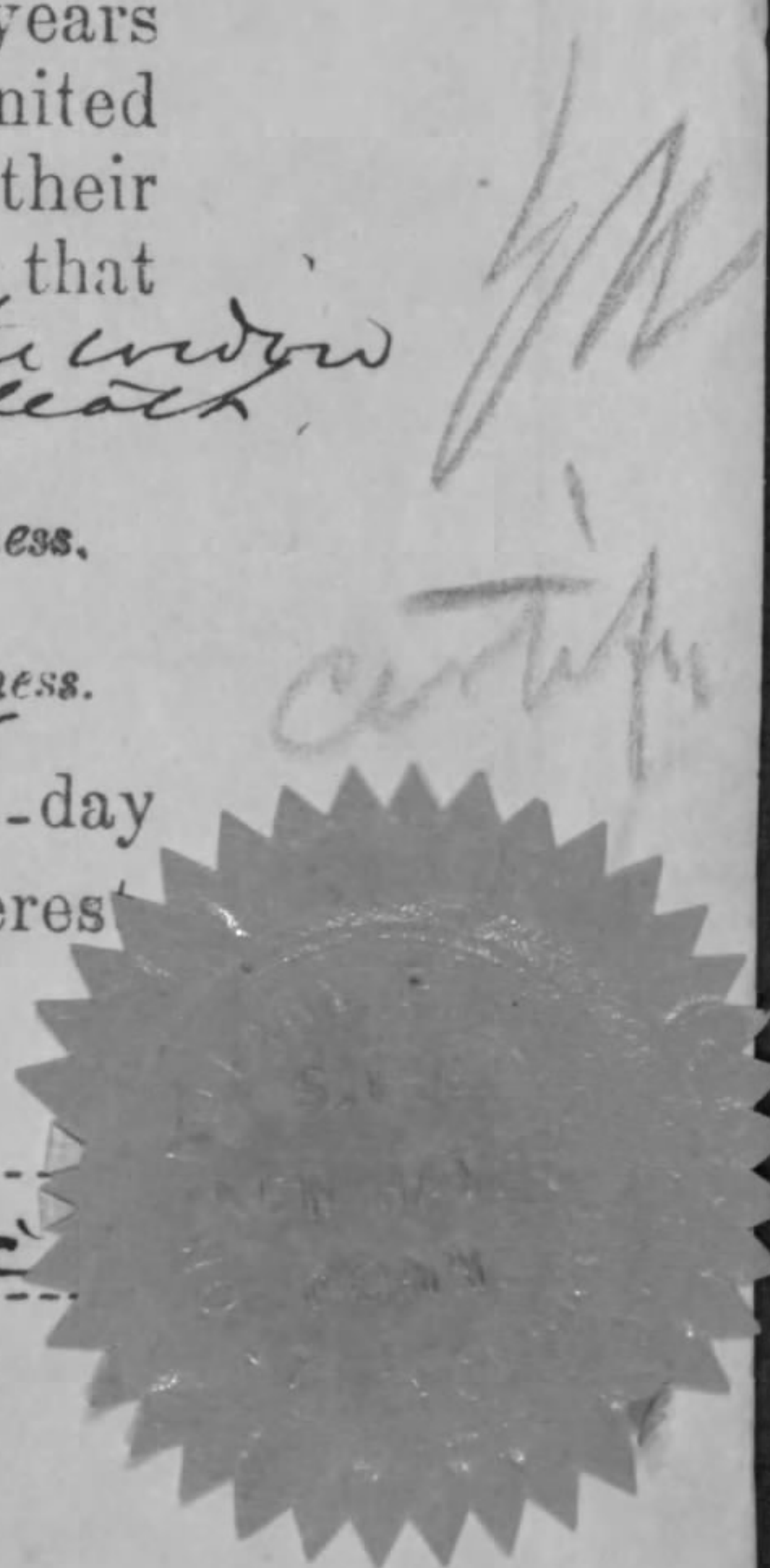

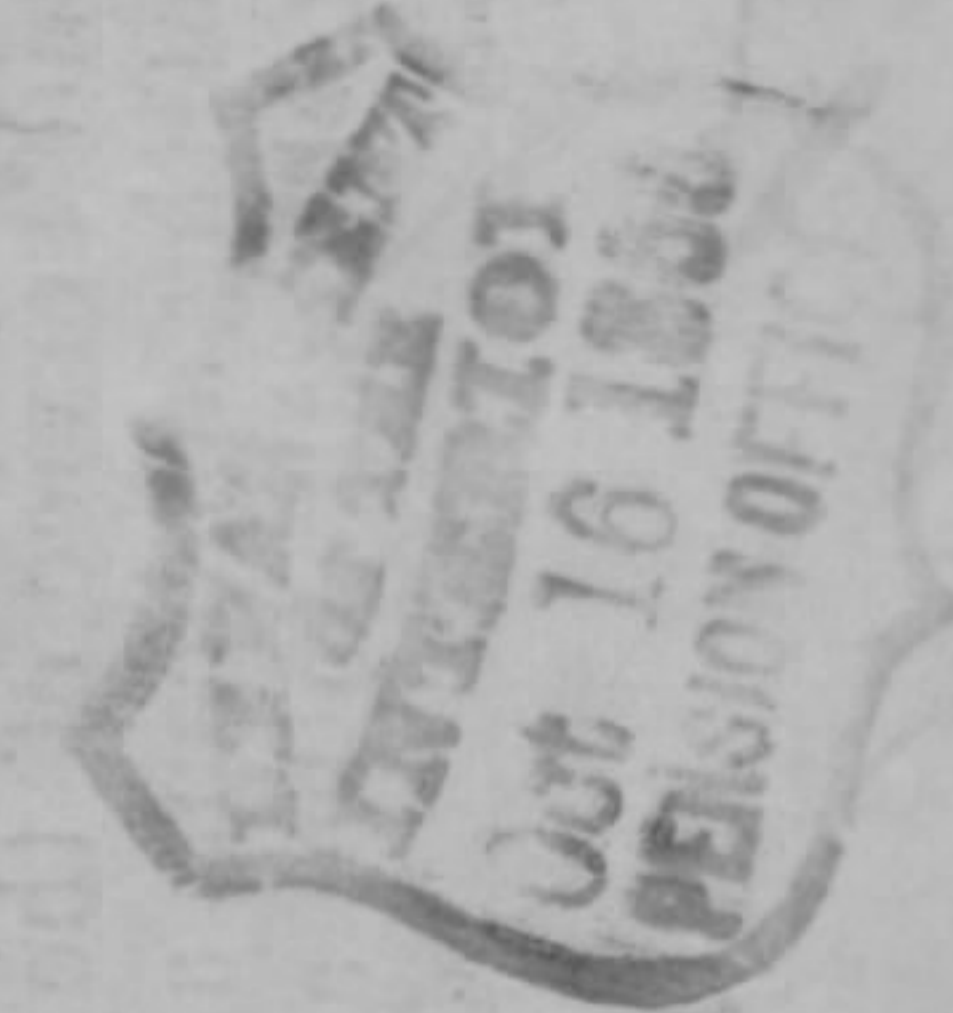
