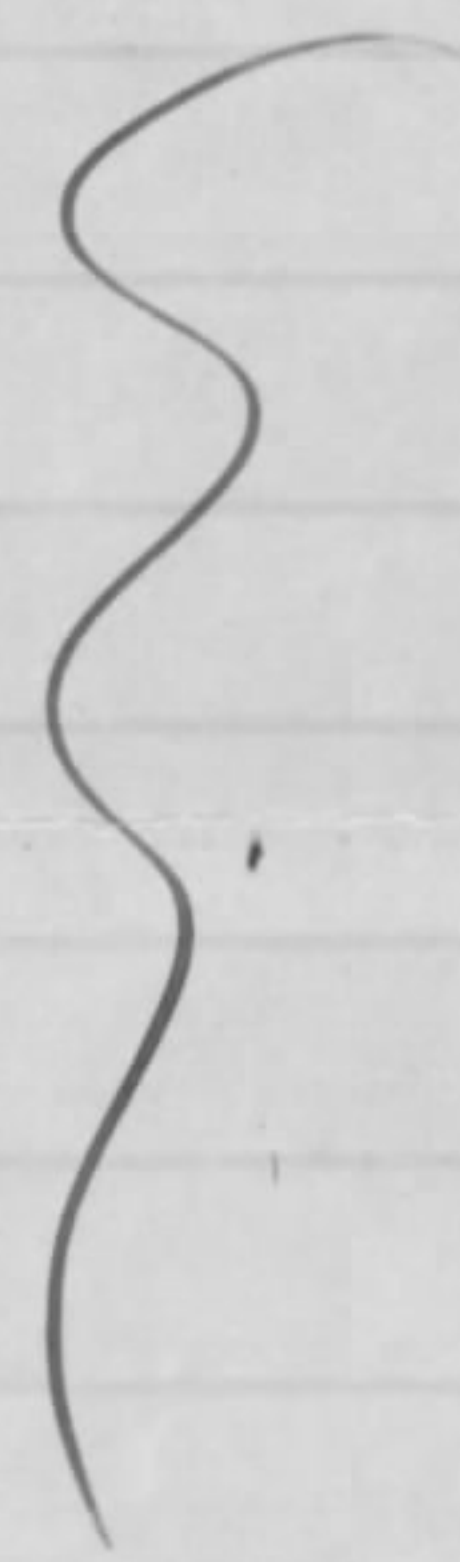

law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision
made by the Act of Congress, approved July 14th, 1862, that she is the widow of Jonathan
G. Norton who was a Corporal in the 1st Connecticut Light Battery
commanded by A. P. Rockwell in the Regiment of
Connecticut Volunteers in the War of 1861, who Died at Folly Island
on the 14th day of October A. D. 1863 of Typhoid
Fever. She further declares that he said Husband left
no Children

She further declares that she was married to the said Jonathan G. Norton
on the 25th day of November in the year 1857 that her husband
the aforesaid Jonathan G. Norton died on the day above mentioned
and that she has remained a widow ever since that period, as will more fully appear by reference to
the proof hereto annexed. She also declares that she has not, in any manner, been engaged in, or
aided or abetted the rebellion in the UNITED STATES.
