I have the honor to inform you that Private Patrick Murphy Co "A" 5th Conn Vols was transferred to 143rd Co 2nd Batt V.R.C. by G.O. No 151 War Dept A.G.O. Washington D.C. April 6, 1864. The Descriptive List I have of him signed by Edwin E. Carter Co "G" 5th Conn Vols Oct. 15, 1863. reports him a deserter from June 13th 1863. I would request to know the circumstances connected with his desertion in order that I may prefer charges against him and have him Court Martialed, and clear up his case, as his term of service expired July 22, 1861 and he cannot be mustered out until the charge of Desertion against him is cleared up.

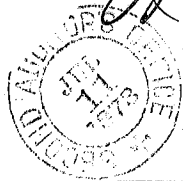

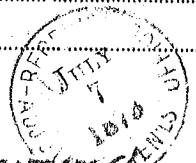
