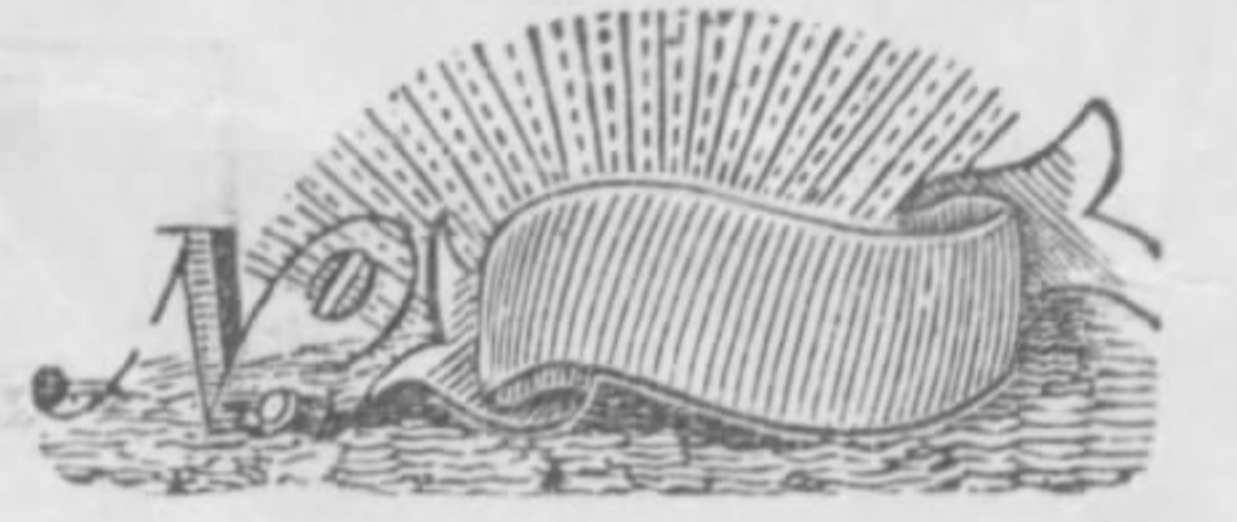
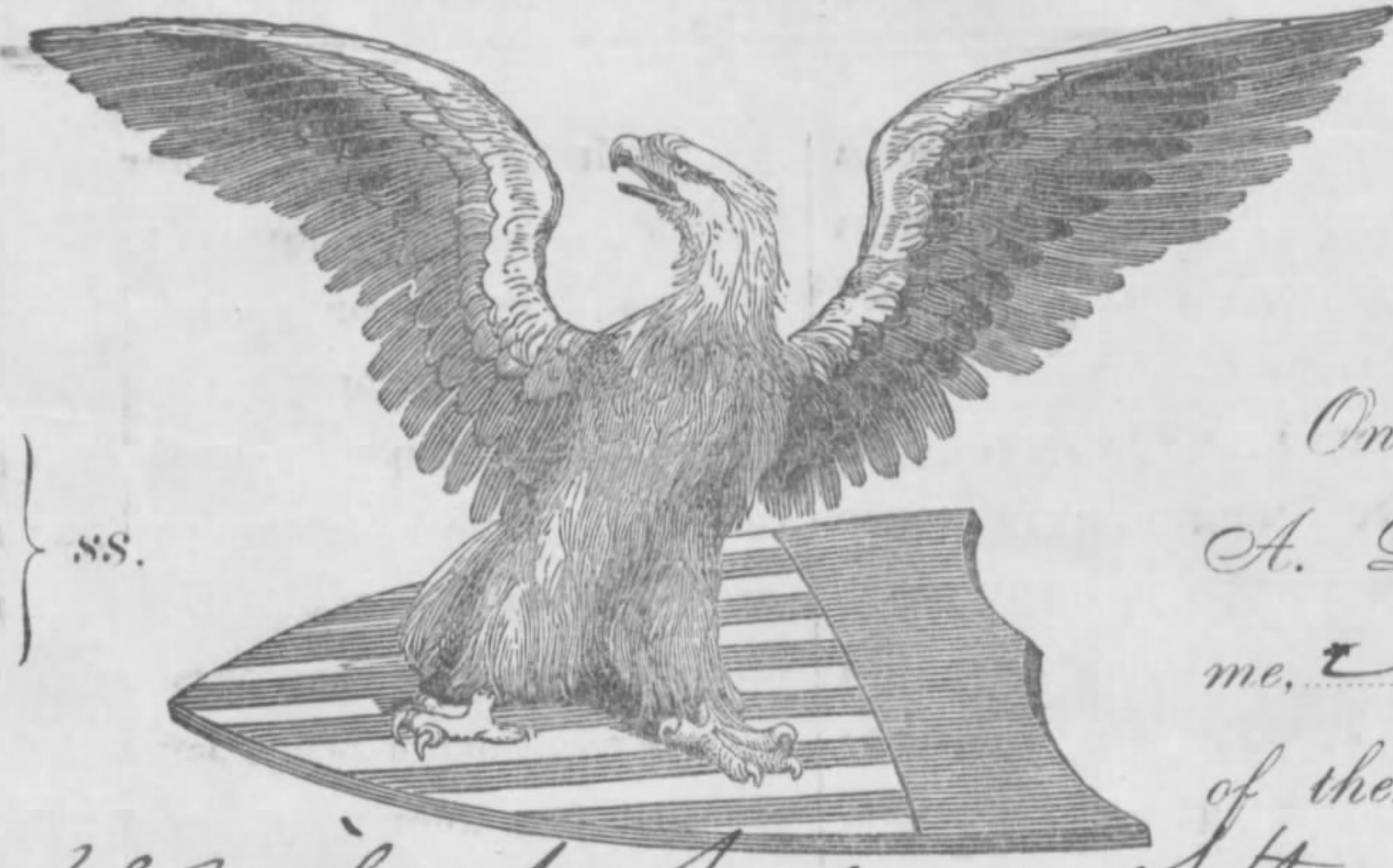

Juliette S Dowd a resident of said State of Connecticut, resident of
in the County of New Haven and State of Connecticut
aged eighteen years, who being first duly sworn according to
law, doth on her oath make the following declaration, in order to obtain the benefit of the provision made by
the Act of Congress, approved July 14th, 1862, that she is the widow of Benjamin R Dowd
who was a private in Company K
commanded by Captain Stiles in the 15th Regiment of
Connecticut Volunteers in the War of 1861, who was married to the
Undesignated claimant on the 20th of March 1862 by the Rev. Asa
Pierce of said town of Branford a Congregationalist, and that the
said Dowd died at a boarding house in Washington Dc of the
Typhoid fever on the 4th day of December 1862 a disease contracted in
the military service of the United States. She further declares that she was married to the said Dowd
on the 20th day of March in the year 1862 that her husband,
the aforesaid Dowd died on the day above mentioned,
and that she has remained a widow ever since that period, as will more fully appear by reference to the proof hereto
annexed. She also declares that she has not, in any manner, been engaged in, or aided or abetted the rebellion in
the UNITED STATES.
