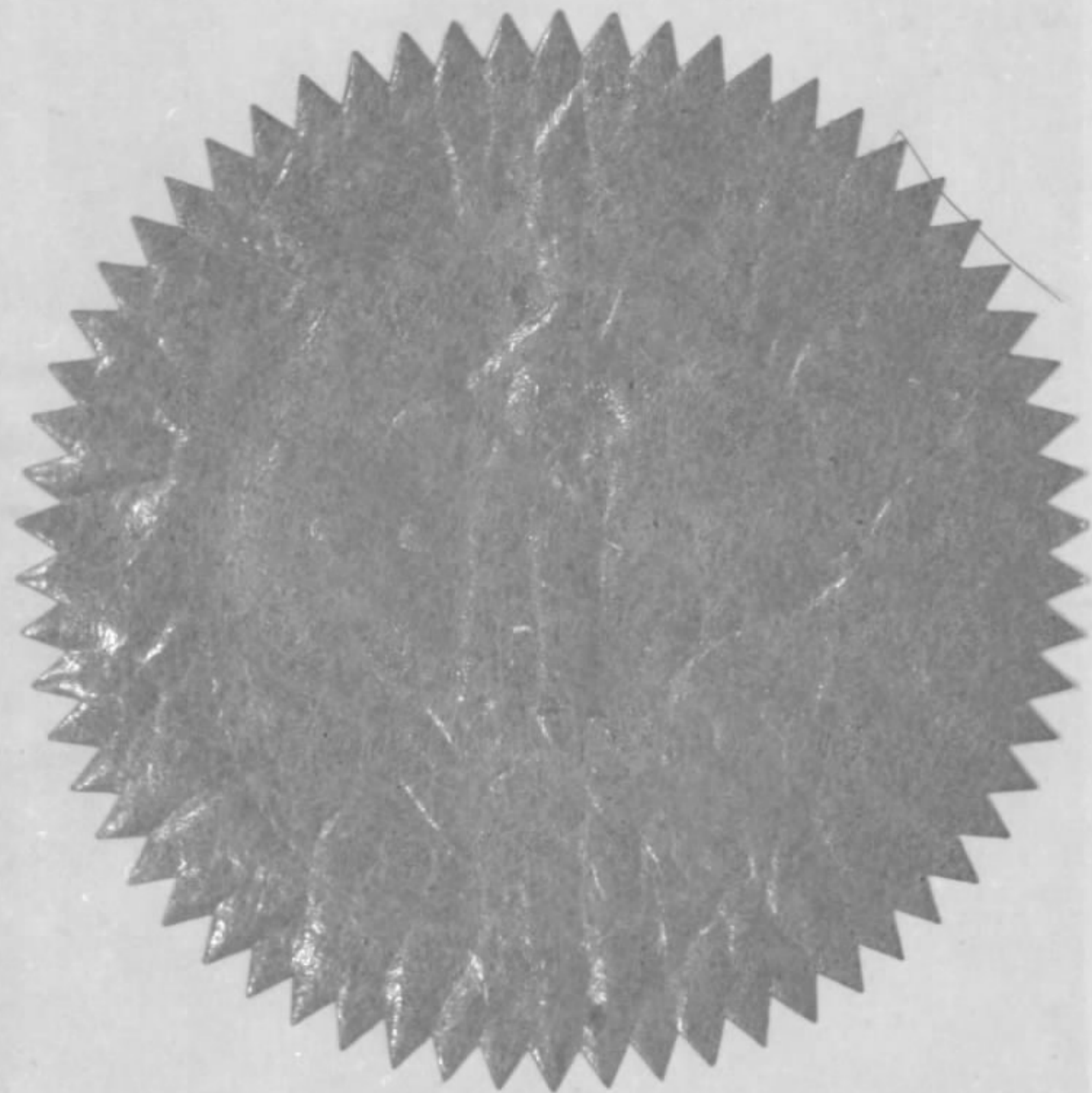
That the following are the names and ages of all the children of the said Richard H. Fowler deceased, viz,
